**PennDOT to Rebuild Eastbound Ramps at Erford Road Bridge over
Camp Hill Bypass in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County**

Weekend detour to close eastbound ramps May 10-13.

Harrisburg, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced today that starting at 9:00 PM on Friday night, May 10, weather permitting, its contractor will close the eastbound Camp Hill Bypass ramp to Erford Road and the Erford Road ramp toward Harrisburg to fully reconstruct the ramps and a portion of the roadway near Wormleysburg Borough in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County.

This portion of Erford Road, officially designated as State Route 1025, averages more than 11,745 vehicles traveled daily.

PennDOT awarded the \$7,789,631 design-build superstructure replacement contract to J.D. Eckman, Inc., of Atglen, Chester County, in which the contractor has been responsible for some of the design requirements for the removal of the existing 66-year-old two-lane three-span continuous steel I-beam bridge, full-depth reconstruction of the ramps, realignment of the roadway, and construction of a new wider bridge superstructure that will accommodate two through lanes and a center-turn lane. Construction of this bridge began in mid-September 2018 and is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2019.

PennDOT advises travelers that the contractor will not restrict travel lanes weekdays on Erford Road between 6:00 AM and 8:30 AM, and between 3:30 PM and 6:00 PM, or on the Camp Hill Bypass between 6:00 AM and 9:00 PM. More information on specific changes to existing traffic patterns will be provided as construction progresses.

Motorists are reminded to be alert for these operations, to obey work zone signs, and to slow down when approaching and traveling through work zones, not only for their safety, but for the safety of the road crews.


