No Increase in 2015 Taxes

Township residents will enjoy another year without an increase in taxes, under the 2015 spending plan approved by Township Commissioners.

Real estate tax rates remain the same at 1.05 mills, which means the owner of a home assessed at \$100,000 will still pay \$105, the same as last year.

They said 2015 spending will include the purchase of two police cars, increases in recreation programs, improvements to the Township's park system and software updates.

Holiday Trash Collection

Trash and recyclables will be collected on the normal schedule on Dec. 29-31 and then a day late because New Year's Day is on a Thursday. They also will be collected on the normal schedule on Feb. 16, Presidents' Day, and on April 3, Good Friday. During the winter season, residents may experience disruption in service. When severe weather is forecasted garbage and recyclables collection may occur earlier or later on your normal collection day. Please check the townships website for cancellations and changes to Penn Waste's Collection schedule.

House Numbers Must Be Visible

East Pennsboro's police, fire and ambulance services say they are concerned that house address numbers are not readily visible on a large number of the more than 8,000 homes in the Township.

The lack of visible numbers, officials said, can cause delays during an emergency response.

They ask that residents attach large numbers to the house. Numbers painted on curbs can be obscured.

REAL ESTATE TAXES

The 2015 County/Municipal real estate tax notices are scheduled to be mailed on or before March 1 by a Cumberland County vendor. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE YOUR TAX BILL, call the tax office so that we may help you determine why you didn't receive a bill. We have no way of knowing if you didn't receive a bill unless you tell us. For those of you who travel South for the winter months be sure to notify my office as to the address you would like your bills mailed to. We will be sure to get a copy of the bill out to you, as tax bills are not forwarded.

PER CAPITA TAXES

Everyone over the age of 18 should receive a per capita tax bill each March. If you do not receive a bill call the tax office so that we can make sure your bill was mailed to correct address or to make sure your name is on the tax rolls.

PER CAPITA TAXES FOR RESIDENTS OVER 70

If you are 70 years old or over and are paying your per capita tax during the discount period (March 1-April 30) be sure to put your birth date on the bill and sign your name. You will then only pay \$4.90.

PER CAPITA TAXES FOR FULLTIME STUDENTS

Fulltime students only pay half of the per capita tax bill. If paid during the discount period (March 1-April 30) students will pay only \$4.90 when the payment is accompanied by a student form. The forms are available on the Township website, www.eastpennsboro.net, under taxes. They are also available in the tax office.

PER CAPITA TAXES FOR ACTIVE MILITARY

While active, military personnel only pay half the per capita tax bill. If paid during the March 1-April 30 discount period only \$4.90 is due. Be sure to write your service affiliation on the bill and sign your name. Thank you for your service!

ADDRESS CORRECTIONS

Please be sure to make address corrections in writing. It is acceptable to write the correction information on the bill.

COMBINED PAYMENTS

Adding multiple bills together on one check is acceptable. Multiple real estate bills, per capita bills, or both, can be combined as long as they are all county/municipal bills. I only ask that you do not combine county/municipal bills with school bills. These two are separate accounts.

Township Police Accepting Unused Prescription Drugs

The Township Police Department has installed a permanent Med-Return Drug Collection Unit in its first floor reception area at 98 S. Enola Dr. They have collected over 60 pounds of unused medication in the last 4 months.



Residents can dispose of excess and expired prescription drugs and over-the-counter medications in the special container. Liquids, needles and aerosol cans are not accepted. Labels can be removed from the prescription containers.

The collection area is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Drugs can be dropped off with no questions asked.

The Department said disposing of excess drugs is everyone's responsibility, citing the fact that 70 percent of young people abusing prescription pain relievers get them from the family medicine cabinet.

Yard Waste Guidelines

Penn Waste, the Township's trash/recyclables collector, will begin collecting yard waste in March and will continue the service through October.

The Township Yard Waste Facility on South Humer Street is open from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Friday, through October for residential drop-off items. It is closed November to March. Residents must show a valid driver's license for proof of Township residency. The facility is for yard waste only. Township officials said the aim is to make the site easy to use for all residents.

Keep Ground Water From Entering Sewer Lines

Township officials are reminding residents that Township regulations prohibit the discharge of any roof, ground or surface water into any sanitary sewer, directly or indirectly. The regulations also prohibit the connection of a pipe into a sewer line carrying excessively hot water, which may be detrimental to a sewer or to operation of the sewer system.

When a basement floor drain is connected to the sanitary sewer system, there is a potential for a backup of raw sewage into the home if sewer lines become clogged. Any such connection of a drain to the sewer system violates regulations and must be disconnected.

Water from sump pumps or rain gutters that goes into the sewer system causes increased flows to the wastewater treatment plant, especially during heavy storms. The water must be chemically treated, the same as raw sewage, resulting in an increase in the amount of chemicals used and ultimately an increase in cost.





2014-2015 SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

The Township has announced its snow removal policy for the upcoming winter months:

TOWNSHIP ROADS

The Highway Department will begin plowing the most heavily traveled roads first. Salting and cindering will be performed as needed. After the initial plowing, the plow will return to widen the path to provide an area to plow additional snow if another storm occurs before a melting period.

Residents are asked to park their cars in their driveway, if at all possible. It is almost impossible for equipment operators to keep snow from being plowed in front of a driveway. This is not done deliberately. The Highway Department tries to clear all roads. Residents are also asked to move basketball backboards off streets.

Property owners are asked to clear around fire hydrants to ensure fire protection. Valuable time can be lost if firefighters have to clear snow from the hydrant area.
