### IMPORTANT CHANGES FOR FINAL PAYMENTS

December 14 - Final Day to pay with personal check  
December 15 thru December 31 - No Personal Checks

Money Order, Bank Check or Certified Funds ONLY  
by mail or drop box located outside of Township Building.

Per Cumberland County instruction, all payments must be received by the tax office on or before December 31st. This is a change from prior years. Payments received after December 31st will be returned to you. All payments received after December 14th must be paid by money order, bank check or certified funds. By law, I must turn all unpaid property taxes over to the Cumberland County Tax Claim Bureau after December 31st, 2016. All unpaid per capita taxes will be turned over to a delinquent collector which will result in significant, additional fees.

### BILL PAYER CHECKS

It is imperative that your bill number appear on all BILL PAYER CHECKS when used to pay your property and/or per capita taxes. The bill number changes every year. To assure proper application of your payment, please be sure to check your bill carefully and provide the correct information. Providing an incorrect bill number could result in your payment being posted incorrectly.

### ADDRESS CORRECTIONS

If your address has changed or will be changing, please let the tax office know so that we can get these changes made before the 2017 tax bills are prepared. This will help assure that you receive your 2017 bills in a timely manner.

### PER CAPITA TAXES

By law, all residents over the age of 18 should be receiving a personal tax bill. If you have not been receiving a per capita tax bill, please call the tax office so that we can help you determine why you have not been receiving a bill.

## Holiday Trash Collection

Trash and recyclables will be collected on the normal schedule on Columbus Day, Oct. 10 and on Veterans Day, Nov. 11. Because of the Thanksgiving holiday on Nov. 24, trash and recyclables normally collected on Thursday will be collected on Friday. Friday's will be collected on Saturday. They will be collected on the normal schedule Monday through Wednesday.

# 2016 SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

The Township has announced its snow removal policy for the winter months:

## TOWNSHIP ROADS

The Highway Department will begin plowing the most heavily traveled roads first. Salting and cindering will be performed as needed. After the initial plowing, the plow will return to widen the path to provide an area to plow additional snow if another storm occurs before a melting period.

Residents are asked to park their cars in their driveway, if at all possible. It is almost impossible for equipment operators to keep snow from being plowed in front of a driveway. This is not done deliberately. The Highway Department tries to clear all roads. Residents are required to move basketball backboards off streets.

## SNOW/ICE REMOVAL FROM SIDEWALKS

Property owners are reminded that Township regulations require snow and ice to be cleaned from sidewalks within 24 hours after a snowfall ends.

## SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES

Residents are required to remove parked vehicles from streets and roads posted as snow emergency routes if a snow emergency is declared. Snow emergency announcements will be made over local television and radio.

## FIRE HYDRANTS

Property owners are asked to clear around fire hydrants to ensure fire protection. Valuable time can be lost if firefighters have to clear snow from the hydrant area.



## PAY SEWER, TRASH BILLS ONLINE!

The Township is now accepting online payments for sewer and sanitation (trash) accounts. A non-refundable service fee will be applied for the convenience of paying with a credit card. Visit [www.eastpennsboro.net](http://www.eastpennsboro.net) for more information and for a link to the online payment portal.

Please be aware that because of new software your sewer/sanitation account number has changed. If you have automatic payments set up through your financial institution remember to change your account number. The number or a service location address should be printed on the check.

In order to reduce errors and process payments in a timely manner, residents are reminded that if they pay their sewer and trash bill automatically through their financial institution to be sure to list the account number and the service address of the account they are paying. Checks can be made payable to East Pennsboro Township.

For residents who prefer to bring payments to the Administration office, there is an after-hours drop box at the bottom of the stairs of the Township Building for your convenience.


## Eagle Scout Honor Received







## MS-4, What is MS-4?

MS-4 is an acronym for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System. The Highway Department is responsible for the cleaning and maintenance of over 4,000 storm sewer inlets and piping infrastructure for the inlets. Our storm sewers drain into creeks, streams, rivers and ultimately the Chesapeake Bay.

**MS-4 ILLICIT DISCHARGE** - Federal regulations define an illicit discharge as "...any discharge to an MS4 (storm sewer) that is not permitted or composed entirely of storm water. The most common sources of illicit discharge are:

Sanitary wastewater	Effluent from septic tanks
Car washing wastewater	Improper Oil Disposal
Radiator flushing disposal	Draining swimming pools
Laundry wastewater	Spills from roadway accidents
Improper disposal of auto and household toxics"	




## PROPERTY MAINTENANCE REMINDER

This is a reminder regarding care and maintenance of vegetation on your properties. All trees above sidewalks require a minimum clearance of nine (9) feet, while trees above Township roadways require a minimum clearance of twelve (12) feet.

Grass should be kept to a height no more than six (6) inches including all areas up to the paved road surface. And in all cases vegetation should not create an obstruction to view at roadways and roadway intersections.

While on occasion, in the past, the East Pennsboro Township Department of Public Works has trimmed tree limbs and cut brush along the Right-of-Way, it is important that property owners take responsibility for the regular ongoing maintenance. As such, please be sure to cut and remove any limbs along streets & walkways which are lower than the above-mentioned heights.
